Pedagogy of Freedom, by Paulo Freire. Pedagogy of Freedom was published at the end of Paulo Freire's career, just before he died. It comes with the benefit of decades of experience and reflection, and it can be read as a culmination of his theory.

Freire developed an approach to education that links the identification of issues to positive action for change and development. While Freire's original work was in adult literacy,

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his approach leads us to think about how we can 'read' the society around us. For Freire, the educational process is never neutral.

Paulo Freire (1921-1997) was a Brazilian philosopher and educator, best known for his model of "critical consciousness," a forerunner of critical pedagogy. Freire considered education a force for empowerment and liberation. As such, he argued a pedagogical approach should be developed with rather than for the students, especially those who come from oppressed, marginalized populations.

### **Educational Philosophy and Theory: Paulo Freire Centennial**

Paulo Reglus Neves Freire was a professor and philosopher known for his work with adult illiterates and for promoting critical pedagogy, a theory and philosophy of education. He believed that each student has a way of thinking critically and is not just a passive recipient of knowledge or education from a teacher.

Paulo Freire argued for informed action and as such provided a useful counter-balance to those who want to diminish theory. Third, Freire's attention to naming the world has been of great significance to those educators who have traditionally worked



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with those who do not have a voice, and who are oppressed.

Freire asserts that distortion of humanization may cause the oppressed to retaliate to the oppressors in an effort to recover their humanity. He believes this action by the oppressed changes them into “oppressors of the oppressors” a situation that makes their effort worthless (Freire 2004, p. 45).
